External Validation



Today, Kellyville Ridge PS completed a process of External Validation. Once during a five-year cycle, schools in NSW undergo this process. An independent panel comprising of a Principal, School Leadership (PSL) and a peer principal considers the school's evidence of progress using the standards articulated in the School Excellence Framework (SEF). External validation provides an opportunity for schools to discuss their judgements about the school's practice, and the evidence that underpins them, with a panel of peers. The aim of the 'EV' is to investigate how the elements of SEF are embedded in our school practices and School Plan and are being successfully delivered by examining the body of evidence. The comprehensive report provides an analysis and evaluates our current practice at Kellyville Ridge Public School against each of the domains and elements of the SEF. Kellyville Ridge PS Executives worked collaboratively to collect and analyse each piece of evidence against the SEF and our School Plan 2021-2024. I want to thank the executive team for their contribution to the EV submission and particularly to Mrs Ross and Mrs Schiffl for working tirelessly alongside me in the rigorous analysis and triangulation of evidence and data to support our on-balance judgements. The 'EV' panel reaffirmed our judgements in all but one domain, where they rated us at a higher level that we rated ourselves. This close correlation is what the school is looking to achieve, to ensure our evaluative processes and practices are robust to determine our alignment with the Statements of Excellence. I wish to thank the entire staff for their contribution of evidence and discussions around our practices and process. As a school we have made progress and the 'EV' panel were delighted with the improvements and future directions of the school. Well done everyone.

Education Week



Education Week (Monday 26 July – Friday 30 July) is an annual, state-wide event that celebrates public education in NSW with an emphasis on students, educators and the communities that support them. In Education Week 2021, the theme of 'Lifelong Learners' celebrates education as a lifelong journey from before a child enters an early childhood setting, progressing to primary and secondary school, and continuing their learning journey into adulthood; learning a trade, entering tertiary education, or the workforce.

Stage 3 Lockdown Lessons at Taronga Zoo

Stage 3 Lockdown Lessons at Taronga Zoo

Stage 3 were determined to not let a lockdown get in the way of a great opportunity to visit Taronga Zoo during Weeks 1 and 2!

Alright, so perhaps they couldn't get there physically, but they enthusiastically attended the Virtual Zoo Lockdown Lessons offered by the Taronga Institute of Science & Learning educators and keepers. Created especially for these times of remote learning, the half hour lessons have introduced Stage 3 to Remarkable Reptiles, Furry Friends, Desert Dwellers as well as Predators and Prey.

Students from years 5 and 6 have begun their Adaptations science unit of work already this term via remote learning, and are making connections and applying prior knowledge based on the virtual lessons from Taronga Zoo.

Students have been introduced to many Australian reptiles, birds, amphibians, monotremes, mammals, marsupials, arthropods and arachnids during the lessons. They have discovered that these creatures have adapted to their specific environments in many interesting and clever ways over many, many years. These adaptations enable the animal to not only survive, but thrive in particular biomes.

Stage 3 are eagerly awaiting the Friday lessons *Exotic Encounters* and *Australian Animals* and are hoping that these amazing lessons continue throughout the remote learning period.

Kellyville Ridge experienced wonderful success at the carnival, with our team consisting of Lachlan, Brayden and Jacob placing first overall in the Year 5/6 Relay category.
