2023 New Enrolments

Please be advised that the school is now taking enrolments for all Years for the beginning of 2023. If you have a child

already attending KRPS and have a child starting school next year, please complete and submit an enrolment form as soon as possible. We have submitted our projected numbers for 2023. All school staffing (teaching, non-teaching and specialist teachers), buildings and resources are based on enrolment numbers submitted. If you are aware of families who live in the catchment area and intend on sending their child/ren to KRPS in 2023, please ask them to make contact with the office to complete an enrolment form. It is essential to the smooth beginning of the year, that we have the enrolments numbers as accurate as possible.

Tell Them From Me

Late this term, Kellyville Ridge Public School is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed on-line and is run by an independent research company, *The Learning Bar*, which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will not be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

This survey will help our school better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will help the school identify what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped. If you do not want your child to take part in the survey, please email the school within the next week.



Seona: "Today, the greatly acknowledged author, Tim Harris, visited our school. He talked about his life and his experiences. Many of his books were inspired by true stories. Some examples he gave were his son's first day at kindergarten and his 7th grade swimming carnival. He was incredibly humorous and fun. His stories made everyone laugh. He told us about his career as a teacher and many of his experiences. He was a large dreamer with an even larger personality. He is an inspiring person, and he makes me feel amazingly comfortable. Overall, I enjoyed it a lot and I look forward to discovering some of his books".



Barry: "This author visit was so fun and funny. He talked about all his funny memories, and how he wrote books based on them. I had loads of fun listening to him. Tim Harris used to be a teacher and pulled pranks on his students. He ended the session by signing books and bookmarks. Everyone loved meeting him and listening to him.

WHAT DID WE DO IN SCIENCE?

SPOTLIGHT ON STAGE 1

This week Stage 1 understood that sound is made by vibrations and that we can make musical instruments vibrate by shaking, hitting, scraping and blowing them. The students produced and described different sounds by investigating various percussion instruments. They worked scientifically to observe, record, and compare their observations. Next lesson students will investigate the loudness of sounds and that we can change the volume of sound.
